Printer Options

Superscript supports the CBM Dot Matrix printer as standard but it also interfaces to all major printers, and much of the hard work is done for you. A library of printer definitions is supplied and you simply choose one – making any changes you need to include special features for your printer.

Once you've defined your printer settings, these remain as standard until you change them, although you can place commands in your document to override the standard settings if you wish.

Mailshots with Superscript

Run personalized mailings using output taken from your database, spreadsheet, or from a manually entered data file.

Merging can be selective. With equal-to/not-equal-to logic you can decide which records in your data file are to be included in or excluded from the mailing.

A mailing labels template helps you with label production to finish the job properly. Alter the labels template or create your own for a variety of label formats.

Will Superscript link to my database?

That depends on your database, but Superscript integrates easily with Superbase and a range of others including Magpie/Micromagpie, Figaro 64, The Consultant. Any database, in fact, that is capable of producing standard sequential files.

What is Superscript ?

Superscript is a combination of word processor, the Superspell spelling checker (both UK and US spellings available), calculator, and mailshot facility, all in one package.

That means that it offers you fast and effective text handling for the efficient production of a wide range of documents, including reports, tables, lists, invoices, mailshots, and even labels.

Two Levels of Command Entry – for Beginners and Advanced Users

Superscript commands, in the form of menus, appear at the top of the screen. Each command is one word only, and there's an additional line of Help text giving further information. Once you have the menu you want on the screen, you just select what you need. You don't even have to type the command!

Entering commands in this way is so easy, you can do almost everything using only the menus and the Help line hints.

More experienced users can bypass the menus by just typing the first letter of each command, which is much faster.

The Choices

Superscript gives you control over your working conditions. Although you work with a 40 column screen, you can extend your editing line to a maximum of 240 columns for wider documents like financial statements.

Superscript operates in 64K of memory, with one or more disk drives.

Superscript and Text Handling

Superscript's comprehensive range of text handling facilities include full block manipulation for cut-and-paste; overtyping or text insertion mode; search and replace with pattern matching, forward and backward search, and case discrimination; case shifts for single words or larger blocks of text. And lots more.

Control Over Your Output

You control the layout of your documents with standard values, or you can place your own commands to specify margins, etc., within a document. Layout options include centering and justification, bold and underlined text, headers and footers, and variable auto page numbering.

Superscript's print preview option lets you make sure your document is correct before you print, so you know exactly what you'll get.

Superscript's simplified document selection cuts down typing too. For many disk operations, a list of your documents is displayed – you just move a highlighted bar onto the name of the document you want and press one key.

Build Your Own Commands

With Superscript, you can cut work down to a minimum by storing over 1000 characters of commands and text. So, with just 2 keystrokes, you can reproduce commonly used words or phrases, names and addresses in multi-line format, or whole command sequences of your own creation.

Almost a Spreadsheet

Superscript's complete set of calculator functions can be used interactively, or you can operate on numbers from the text of your document. Apart from the usual mathematical functions like add, subtract, multiply, divide, and percentages, you have the ability to add rows, columns, or even whole tables.

Superscript gives you almost as much mathematical power as a spreadsheet, but you don't need to buy one.
